## PHILIP BARBOUR HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE WEST VIRGINIA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-3 sophomore raced to the Class A-AA individual state championship this past season with a time of 19:29.3, leading the Colts to a third-place finish as a team. The 2015 Big 10 Conference Runner of the Year, Melvin won the Class A-AA Region II title, crossing the line in 19:54.

Melvin has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom and represents one of the state's top academic candidates in meeting the Gatorade award's broad criteria. A member of the National Honor Society, she has participated locally in multiple 4-H Club events and competitions.

"Jessica Melvin loves to run for the pure enjoyment of the sport," said Philip Barbour head coach Jim Seaton. "She trains hard and sets the standard for the rest of our team. She is truly dedicated to the sport of cross country."

Melvin will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
